

Hatch A Hundred

Creating Nest Boxes for American Kestrels

American Kestrels are our smallest falcon, but play a crucial role as an avian predator of fields and meadows. Decades of habitat loss, including nesting sites, and other environmental challenges have impacted their population. In 2012, they became a threatened species in New Jersey.

In 2019, FoHVOS spearheaded a program to grow kestrel numbers by providing nest boxes across the Hopewell Valley. Over the past five years, there's been a 400% increase in nest box use, and in 2024 we hatched 81 kestrel chicks!

With the most successful American Kestrel nesting program in the state, our goal for 2025 is to Hatch A Hundred kestrels. To do this, we've partnered with Wild Bird Research Group, to increase installed nest boxes, collect additional data, and enhance our reach.

Timeline to Hatch A Hundred!

- January: Offering public programming and building nest boxes. Meeting with potential landowners.
- February: Install 25 new nest boxes.
- March July: Perform nest box monitoring.
- **September**: Share end of season Hatch A Hundred successes!
